The initiative was created during the participation in the creation of the local youth program “Youth and the City Together 2019-2021”, when it was established that Dubrovnik lacks this kind of youth association that focuses on these topics. The association works closely with CKM Dubrovnik, where it is a partner and collaborator on numerous projects and activities, including the development of The Student Guide.

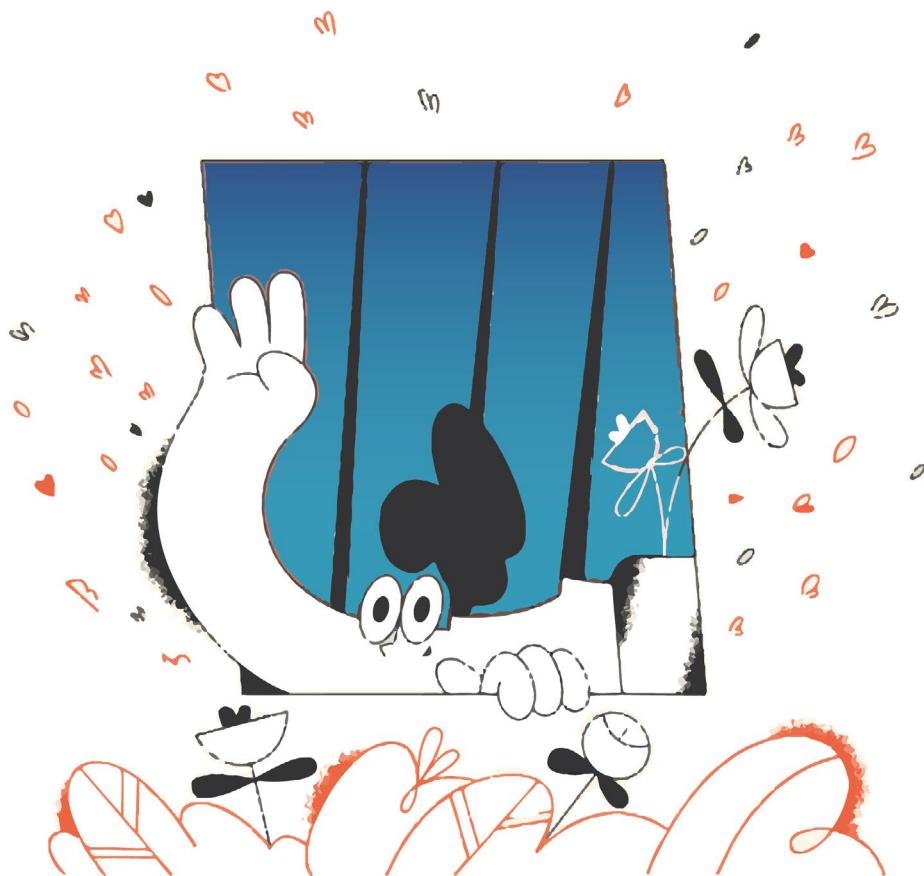

# GLOSSARY

***“The Republic of Dubrovnik banned slavery and slave trade in 1416, almost 76 years before Christopher Columbus discovered America. This decision was found in the part of the Dubrovnik Statute that talks about the maritime domain, in which it was written that everyone on board of the ship is considered a free person. It thus became the first country in Europe to ban human trafficking and slavery, while in the rest of Europe it was allowed until the 19th century.”***



**AAI** — authentication and authorization infrastructure of the science and higher education system in the Republic of Croatia. It is important because its system contains electronic identities of members of the academic community and the research community in the Republic of Croatia. AAI@Edu.hr user account (known as CARNET account) is used to log in to Studomat and the e-Citizens system, Central State Portal.

**The academic quarter** — a quarter of an hour (15min) is related to the beginning of the lecture. The professor has the opportunity to start the lecture with a delay of 15 minutes.

**Advanced university student** — a student who attended all lectures but did not graduate. The reason for this is an unfinished diploma thesis or a certain exam that has not yet been passed.

**ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System)** a system of collecting and transferring points, based on the learning process and outcome. One point is 25 to 30 working hours, and 60 points is the amount of student workload for one academic year. 180 is the maximum number of points in undergraduate and 120 in graduate programs.

**JMBAG (Jedinstveni Matični Broj Akademskog Građana)** — is awarded by enrolling in a higher education institution.

**Colloquium** — at some colleges, colloquia are a substitute for the exam. So, if you pass all the colloquia of a certain course, you are exempt from the exams. In other cases, colloquia may only be a prerequisite for taking the exam.

**Consultations** — time of the week when the professor, assistant or someone who works with students has office hours for additional questions of students (seminar papers, presentations, colloquia, exams, ambiguities in the material, etc.).

**Partial** — a term that indicates that a student has not completed all obligations in the previous academic year, and is not able to enroll for the entire next academic year, but only partially.

**Pre-term** — a written (or oral) exam that allows students to pass the exam before the official start of the exam deadlines.

**Bachelor's degree** — (baccalaureus), or university bachelor's degree (baccalaurea) and (eng. bachelor's degree) is an academic degree that is acquired after 3 or 4 years of education.

**X-card** — a popular name for a student ID card. It serves as proof of student status and the canteen and often provides discounts at various cultural institutions.

**Rector** — the head of the university, a full-time professor who is elected by the university council for a certain period of time as the head of the university.

**Rector's Award** — an annual award for the best student work of scientific or artistic content or for the best grades.

**Semester** — a period of half an academic year (a total of two semesters in one academic year).

**Script** — student notes made on the basis of the professor's lectures, ie an abbreviated version of the book for the needs of students and exam preparation.

**Scripting room** — a place within the faculty where you can buy books and student forms related to studying at a particular faculty.

**Student office** — a place where students obtain information related to all relevant matters of interest (student status, applications, classification procedure, enrollment at the Faculty, receiving student applications, keeping student archives and personal files of students, entering data into the ISVU system and issuing certificates of student status).

**Student Union** — the umbrella representative body of students whose members are students enrolled in undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate studies at the University of Dubrovnik. The role is to represent students in all bodies of the University, as well as in university institutions such as the Student Center and SRCE, in contacts with the Ministry of Science, Education and Sports and all other state bodies for student discussions.

**Student Ombudsman** — an academic institution that addresses issues of academic relations and the protection of students' rights and freedoms. There are student ombudsmen at the faculties and the University ombudsman in charge of university level issues.

**Studomat** — an information system that enables the systematization and recording of data and communication of entities within the university community in the Republic of Croatia.

**Studomat serves students for:**

- registration or cancellation of the exam,
- review of the exam schedule in writing,
- review of written exam results,
- finding a schedule for the oral exam,
- enrollment in the academic year,
- selection of elective courses,
- requesting the printing of various certificates,
- a review of the status of its financial obligations to the university

***If a student does not take the exam and does not cancel it on time, it will be marked as a failed exam, which also means the loss of one exam period!***

***Studomat can be accessed via an online kiosk located at the college or via any computer that has an internet connection. If it is accessed via the Internet, it must go to the address: [www.isvu.hr/studomat](http://www.isvu.hr/studomat).***

**Meal subsidy for students** — the amount on the student ID card that is awarded to students every 1st and 15th day of the month with the prior cancellation of the unused amount from the previous period.

**Prerequisite** — the minimum number of ECTS credits that must be achieved within the given deadline if the student wants to enroll in the next academic year.

# STUDENT HOUSING

The long-awaited student dormitory in Dubrovnik is the most modern in the Republic of Croatia. Its appearance, content, and accessibility place the city of Dubrovnik among the greatest university cities in Croatia. The dormitory **provides accommodation for over 500 students. 295 accommodations have been set aside for marginalized students in unfavorable socio-economic positions or with disabilities.** The monthly price for accommodation, for students entitled to subsidized housing, is 850kn per bed in a double room. Utilities included.

In order to qualify for accommodation in the dormitory, you must be a full time student, a student of a higher education institution, a citizen of the Republic of Croatia or an EU member state with approved alien status in the Republic of Croatia. If you are employed in crafts, freelance or agriculture and forestry, you do not qualify for accommodation in the dormitory. **Applications, with proper documentation, must be submitted in person or mail at the student center in Dubrovnik by April 30, 2020.**



# STUDENT CENTER

Student Center Dubrovnik is a public institution that has been taking care of the standard of living of students in Dubrovnik since 1963. As part of its activities, **the Student Center takes care of student accommodation, food, employment, as well as cultural and sports activities in the City.**

## WHO CAN JOIN?

### Full-time and Part-time students

- students who study at higher education institutions in the Republic of Croatia and are citizens of the Republic of Croatia.
- students who are EU citizens residing in the Republic of Croatia and studying at a higher education institution outside the Republic of Croatia or exchange students while studying in the Republic of Croatia, and who do not have an established employment relationship and / or are not self-employed, are a freelancer and/or employed in forestry and agriculture.

### Other persons

- who study at higher education institutions in the Republic of Croatia and are citizens of the Republic of Croatia.
- an EU citizen with residence in the Republic of Croatia, who has completed his / her studies at a higher education institution outside the Republic of Croatia and does not have an established employment relationship.

***Rights under the Act may be exercised by other persons for a maximum of 3 months from the end of the school year in which they completed secondary education, or for a maximum of the end of the academic year in which they completed their studies or until the expiration of 3 months from completion.***

### Students from abroad

- before starting work, they must report to the Police Station (MUP) and get a certificate of temporary ID number and OIB, check if they have compulsory health insurance (and regulate their status, if they do not) and then come to the Student Center where they will a membership card and a Student Performance Agreement are issued.

### — Students with dual citizenship

when joining the Student Service, they should also present an official document with a Croatian OIB, have a registered residence and compulsory health insurance.

***You can check if you have compulsory health insurance at [www.hzzo.hr](http://www.hzzo.hr). In case you do not have it, you must resolve your insurance status at the regional office of the Croatian Health Insurance Institute (HZZO) according to your place of residence.***

## NECESSARY DATA FOR THE ISSUANCE OF THE CONTRACT:

- ID card (for inspection)
- OIB (if not stated on the ID card)
- 1 small format photo
- a valid student ID card (x-ica)
- contract or bank certificate (for inspection) with the IBAN of the personal giro account opened with a commercial bank with which Student centre Dubrovnik has a cooperation agreement
- certificate of the higher education institution where you are studying (certified and translated into Croatian), copy of birth certificate, certificate of residence in the Republic of Croatia (refers to students of Croatian citizenship studying abroad)
- confirmation of student status in the Republic of Croatia and certificate of temporary residence (foreign students, EU citizens)
- a copy of the diploma or a certificate of completion of the academic education, but no later than the end of ac. year in which the study was completed or until the expiration of a period of three months from the completion of the study (refers to students listed as "other persons")

## CONTRACTS

*A contract is issued at the request of the member before the start of student work.*

### **Necessary data for the issuance of the contract:**

- name and / or OIB of the employer
- description of the work to be performed
- agreed price per hour
- work place
- start and end dates of work

*The contract (completed and signed) should be submitted to the SC for calculation immediately after the completion of the work - so that the contract is calculated, issued an invoice and paid by the employer within 15 days of completion (Article 13, paragraph 2 of the Law on Student business). In order to speed up the student payment process, the contract for submission can be submitted scanned to [scdu@unidu.hr](mailto:scdu@unidu.hr).*

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Every year, the Student Center organizes a public bidding for financial support in the implementation of activities or projects in the field of cultural, sports, scientific and educational activities. These activities are carried out by students, student choirs and student associations, and are intended exclusively for students. For many years, the Student Center has been helping to finance a number of events, some of them are the Student Rowing Regatta "Semper Primus" and the student basketball tournament "Vedran Jelavić". They are being held in the city of Dubrovnik.

# DUBROVNIK

Dubrovnik has been a part of the Dubrovnik Republic for a large part of its history, and the Republic consisted of the City, its surroundings (Konavle, Cavtat, Ston ...) and the surrounding islands. The foundation and most important value for the development of Dubrovnik was its freedom. Without its own army, Dubrovnik preserved its freedom by using skilful diplomacy and conducting extensive consular activities in the Mediterranean and Europe. **Already during the 14th and 15th centuries, Dubrovnik was, along with Venice and Ancona, the most important maritime and trade center on the Adriatic. The Republic of Dubrovnik reached its peak in the 16th century thanks to maritime transport and the development of continental trade networks in the Balkans and the Ottoman Empire.**

With an extremely rich history, Dubrovnik is considered one of the best-preserved medieval cities in Europe, which has been **on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 1979.**



## MUSEUMS



### Cultural — historical museum

- located in the old town in the Rector's Palace, represents the artistic and historical heritage mostly of the last period of the Republic of Dubrovnik.

### Maritime museum

- located in the old town in the fortress of St. John, contains museum material from the maritime past in the area of Dubrovnik, from ancient times.

### Ethnographic museum / Museum Rupe

- originally a granary of the Republic of Dubrovnik. Today, the museum is dedicated to the importance of granary holes (name: Rupe) and presents characteristic Dubrovnik ethnographic exhibits such as costumes, lace and other textile handicrafts.

### Archaeological museum

- there is no permanent space or exhibition. For now, the museum is divided into seven collections: prehistoric, ancient, early medieval, from the 13th century until the earthquake of 1667, the Vase collection, the Egyptian and the numismatic collection.

### Red history museum

- an artistic, historical and research project that presents the history of socialism in Croatia in a unique and interactive way.

### The house of Marin Držić

- the smallest museum in Dubrovnik founded in 1989. It is dedicated to the life and work of the Dubrovnik Renaissance writer Marin Držić.

## GALLERIES



### Art Gallery (Museum of Modern art)

- founded in 1945. It still operates as a public cultural institution. The Museum of Modern Art also manages the Dulčić-Masle-Pulitika Gallery and the Pulitika Studio in the Old Town. To date, the museum has managed to collect a collection of 3,000 works of modern art representing Southeast Europe. The collection includes visual production (sculptures, paintings and graphics, photographs, video and art installations) from the end of the 19th century to the present day and its significance goes beyond the regional and national level.

## THEATRE



### Marin Držić City Theatre

- is a professional theatre founded in 1944 and located in the Old Town of Dubrovnik. The goal of the theater is the sustainability of Croatian and world heritage and the performance of plays with a fundamental focus on modern works and contemporary authors.

## CINEMA



### Cinemas Dubrovnik

- a public institution in Dubrovnik which, in addition to showing films, organizes educational programs, workshops, fashion shows and festivals. Cinemas manage two indoor spaces (Kino Sloboda and Visia Hall) and two summer stages (Slavica Open Air Cinema and Jadran Open Air Cinema).

# TRANSPORT

## LIBERTAS DUBROVNIK

The public transport system in Dubrovnik relies mainly on public city buses, operated by LIBERTAS-DUBROVNIK d.o.o. Tickets can be purchased at a number of different locations, from newsstands, Libertas outlets (at major bus stops) and inside buses.

**Newspaper kiosks sell “s” tickets (unlimited city rides within an hour), but there are also daily tickets (unlimited city rides within 24 hours).**

### **Dubrovnik monthly ticket (prices, student benefits)**

Dubrovnik monthly ticket is mainly used by citizens, pupils, students and retirees for transport by public city buses, and offers a number of benefits. The monthly ticket is made online, on the website of Libertas d.o.o. or at Libertas outlets at major bus stops.

**For students in Dubrovnik, the price of the monthly ticket is 50 kn. The monthly ticket is confirmed every month with the presentation of a certificate of full-time student status in Dubrovnik at Libertas outlets at major bus stops.**



### **With a monthly ticket, you realize a lot of benefits such as:**

- a trip to the island of Lokrum at a ticket price of 20 kn
- watching screenings in the Sloboda cinema, open-air Jadran cinema, Slavica and the Visia cinema at a ticket price of 10 kn
- performances at the Marin Držić Theatre at a ticket price of 10 kn
- concert of the Symphony Orchestra at a ticket price of 10 kn
- matches of the water polo club JUG CROATIA OSIGURANJE by price tickets from 10 kn

# FREE TIME

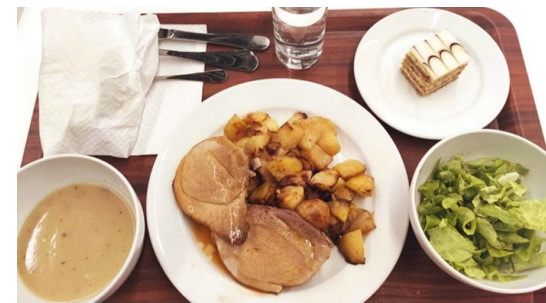

Dubrovnik is one of the oldest and most beautiful cities in Croatia. Given that the population is slightly higher than 42,000, the city has a lively student culture and a very rich cultural life. # USEFUL TIPS

## STUDY TIPS

Many students use time-consuming learning techniques and give the illusion of mastery. They get acquainted with the ideas and information in preparation for the test, but forget them a week later because their learning techniques have never led to long-term learning. **Here are some of the most effective learning techniques that make exam preparation much easier:**

**Pre-test** — when students practice answering questions, even incorrectly, before learning the content, their future learning improves.

**Paraphrasing and reflecting** — as students we often read a few paragraphs from a textbook only to realize that we don't even remember what we just read. One of the more useful learning strategies is to paraphrase or retell a chapter or concept to someone else.

**Concrete examples** — use concrete examples to understand abstract ideas. Most teachers already use this strategy in their own teaching. But what is perhaps more important is that students expand their understanding by presenting their own examples.

**Double coding** — the process of combining verbal materials with visual materials. When reviewing teaching materials, find visual elements that match the information and compare them directly to the words.

**Mind map** — a type of diagram that shows ideas or thoughts in a unique way. The appearance is performed in such a way that the key word or topic is in the center, and other ideas branch around it, with all the concepts being interconnected. The structure of a mind map responds directly to the way our brain stores information, so it uses mental triggers to make it easier for us to remember the content. The purpose of a mind map is to make it easier to understand and remember certain material. The method of making a mind map is a type of visual approach to working on a task or concept that is often complex and broad in order to highlight what is important in it.

### The procedure of switching to a new doctor:

1. Choosing a new doctor: when you arrive at the place of study, start to gather all the information regarding the switching procedure and about the available doctors, which can be found on the website of the Health Center.
2. After agreement with the doctor, students should fill in the application form. You can ask the document at your previous family doctor.
3. Submitting a statement to the HZZO: the newly elected doctor will receive other health documentation from your previous doctor and will instruct you on further procedures. Either the doctor will take the statement and complete the change or refer you to the nearest HZZO office.
